Kaufman published before Giant Swallowtail split. Unrecorded N of Jefferson
Eastern Tiger 20
Uncommon. Canadian and Midsummer more prevalent. Very rare black black female form (Pipevine mimic) may be observed in S NH.

Recent study ('25) confirms the emergence of this new species of Eastern x Canadian lineage in central NH around June 21
