Canadian Tiger 28
Eastern Giant 32
Swift published before Giant Swallowtail split. Unrecorded N of Jefferson
Eastern Tiger 23 (black form), 28
Uncommon. Canadian and Midsummer more prevalent. Very rare black black female form (Pipevine mimic) may be observed in S NH.
